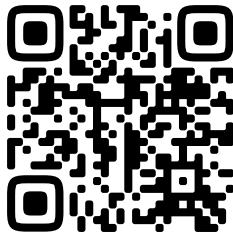

The way out of this situation can be found only with the help of legal means, and it is Russia, with its rich history and unique legal experience, that is able to offer humanity new ways to solve these problems.

Environmental problems are especially noticeable in megacities because of an unbalanced anthropogenic load on the entire ecosystem. The concept of sustainable development territories in this regard is a mechanism of checks and balances that offers a balance between professional (production) activity, associated with the use of natural resources, and the quality of the habitat of residents of megacities, the right to which is enshrined in fundamental legal federal documents.
